





# WHAT IS PLAGIARISM? Take other people's work or ideas and use them as one's own without proper citation or acknowledgement

#### WHAT DOES PLAGIARISM LOOK LIKE?



- 1. COPY the exact words of others without proper citation or acknowledgement
- 2. PATCHWRITING words, sentences, paragraphs, etc of others without proper citation or acknowledgement. Too close to the original text.
- 3. TRANSLATING the work of others without proper citation or acknowledgement
- 4. SELF-PLAGIARISM submit owned previous published work / assignments without proper citation or acknowledgement

#### WHAT DOES PLAGIARISM LOOK LIKE?



- 5. Present IDEAS of others without proper citation or acknowledgement.
- 6. FALSE REPRESENTATION of contribution in group projects
- 7. MAKE UP DATA as part of the submission
- 8. Use IMAGES without proper citation or acknowledgement

**Scientific misconduct** is the violation of the standard codes of scholarly conduct and ethical behavior in the publication of professional scientific research. A *Lancet* review on *Handling of Scientific Misconduct in Scandinavian countries* gave examples of policy definitions. In Denmark, scientific misconduct is defined as "intention[al] or gross negligence leading to fabrication of the scientific message or a false credit or emphasis given to a scientist", and in Sweden as "intention[al] distortion of the research process by fabrication of data, text, hypothesis, or methods from another researcher's manuscript form or publication; or distortion of the research process in other ways."<sup>[1][2]</sup>

A 2009 systematic review and meta-analysis of survey data found that about 2% of scientists admitted to falsifying, fabricating, or modifying data at least once.<sup>[3]</sup>

Preference for inclusion on this list is for individuals or entities with their own Wikipedia article, and for incidents referenced to multiple sources.

This is a dynamic list and may never be able to satisfy particular standards for completeness. You can help by adding missing items with reliable sources.














#### PENALITIES OF PLAGIARISM

#### **HOW TO AVOID PLAGIARISM**



# Use TURNITIN (TII) to check similarity

- Turnitin (TII) database is a plagiarism prevention tool
- Students and lecturers can check the students' works for improper citation, unoriginal content or potential plagiarism
- In HELP, Turnitin is integrated into HELP LMS where students upload their assignments into LMS-TII platform directly for Turnitin to generate the similarity report.

#### **TURNITIN (LMS-TII)**

#### Account



- Students register for the subject
- Faculty provides Username and Password for LMS account

#### **Enroll Class**

- Lecturer creates a class and assignment in LMS-TII
- Lecturer provides the Class ID and Class Enrollment Key (Password) for students to submit an assignment
- Students enroll for the class with the Class ID and Class Enrollment Key provided by the lecturer

#### **Submit Paper**

Upload assignment/document in LMS-TII according to class enrolled

#### **Check Similarity**

- Turnitin generates similarity report
- Result of plagiarism/similarity % (e.g. below 15%)



#### **HOW TO AVOID PLAGIARISM**



1.Paraphrasing: expressing an author's ideas in your own words, through changing both the language and the sentence structure. Cite the sources

- 2.Cite your sources
  - Citation must put in 2 places ie. In Text and Bibliography.
  - Use the citation method of your choice (APA 7<sup>th</sup> ed., HAVARD, MLA, and etc.)
  - Use Mendeley to do citation

#### **HOW TO PARAPHRASE**



# 3 tips on how to paraphrase:


- Try not to directly copy the same word from the page.
- Read it several times to make sure you understand the content.
- Jot down the main ideas of the information you've just read in your own words
